Inspired by the true New Zealand story "Tarore and her Book"

"Broken" is inspired by the true New Zealand story of Tārore, a Māori girl who was murdered in the mid 1800's by a marauding tribe. Tārore always carried with her the Gospel of Luke which was stolen by her murderer. Incredibly, in a time when utu (revenge) was so prevalent, her father decided not to seek revenge for her murder, but instead to follow the message of the book and forgive. When the Gospel was eventually read to Tārore's murderer, he was so filled with remorse that he sought out Tārore's father and asked him for forgiveness. Because of this, peace was made between their two warring tribes and subsequently spread throughout many parts of New Zealand.

Synopsis for Broken the Movie

"Broken" is a modern-day retelling of the true NZ story "Tārore and her Book", made popular by the beloved New Zealand author Joy Cowley.

Logan, an ex-gang leader has left the gang life to raise his daughter Tori. When Tori is murdered by an opposing gang in town, a gang war is inevitable and Logan must choose between revenge or forgiveness as things escalate quickly.

screen. Tarry, along with producer / production manager Sammi Teagle and director of photography / producer Josh Campbell and their small core crew of eight, have managed to create a powerful and impacting film.

Locations, props, clothes and cars

Predominantly shot on the East Coast of New Zealand, the film features sweeping drone shots showcasing the iconic coastal landscape.

To pull together a project of significantly greater quality than the small budget it had would suggest, many volunteer hours, resources and expertise were donated both from City Impact Church people, members of the Gisborne community and House of Breakthrough Church. Members of the Gisborne community were particularly involved in the project providing actors, extras, cars, locations and even some of the catering. The realistic gang patches were what drew in extras from many walks of life.

Casting

Aside from Wayne Hapi who debuted in the New Zealand film "The Dark Horse", Katy Beasley from the classic New Zealand children's television show "Playschool" and Ma'a Brian Sagala who is a Pacific breakfast radio host on Radio 513pi, the cast is made up of unknown actors. The actors in the film volunteered their time and engaged in the process to gain experience and be part of a project with a message.

Josh Calles Logan

Josh has served his hometown of Gisborne as part of the New Zealand police force for 5 years. His experience in the police has helped him bring understanding, passion and intensity to his role as Logan.

Wayne Hapi Cruz

Wayne made his feature film debut as Ariki in the New Zealand film 'The Dark Horse'. He is an accomplished musician and spends much of his time assisting initiatives to help the homeless and people from disadvantaged backgrounds rehabilitate into the community.
